EMILY ABDY RELEASES DEBUT EP 'NOT GETTING ANY'

"Furious, cathartic, unrelenting, and intensely feminist" — UK-born composer and performer Emily Abdy is making a huge splash in the waters of modern British classical music with her debut orchestral EP, 'Not Getting Any'.

The EP consists of three tracks performed by Thallein Ensemble (Royal Birmingham Conservatoire) and Orkest de Ereprijs, recorded over the course of 2017-2020. Drawing from Abdy's personal experiences with misogyny, health, anxiety, and abuse, the record combines classical instrumentation with elements reminiscent of Swans, Thee Silver Mt. Zion, Lingua Ignota and 90's riot grrrl, blending immersive percussion and cathartic orchestration with impassioned chanting from Thallein Ensemble, and pained performances from vocalists Dalma Sinka and Laura Ginström. "This piece was a way of using my voice (and facilitating others to do so)", Abdy states about the meaning behind 'Not Getting Any', "when, like many other womxn (and men), I feel like my experiences and justified anger have been silenced."

Emily Abdy's debut EP shows her to be an innovative and blistering force in the new music world, with her unashamedly feminist and personal take on composition bound to inspire women across the landscape of contemporary music. With two collaborations in the works with Birmingham Record Company (NMC Recordings) — alongside fellow composers Corey Mwamba, Ryan Latimer, and Genevieve Murphy — Abdy is certain to be a figure to watch in 2021 and beyond.
